In addition, both SS Peter and Paul and St John Fisher Primary schools have welcomed Maureen O'Leary for a monitoring visit in November. Both schools have received excellent feedback showing that they are on a strong trajectory in the new Section 48 framework for their next full inspection.



Our pupils, who are effectively led by our PE apprentices now use the equipment regularly for fitness and conditioning sessions and are delighted with the new facilities. We are thrilled to see our playgrounds developing in this way and appreciate the additional sugar tax money which has financed the project.
